

2010 Friendship Star Quilters Guild Service Projects Challenge:

MAKE A PRINTS “CHARM”ING QUILT

RULES:

- You may use as many fabrics (print or solid) and quilting techniques as you choose. The blocks can be any size or shape, but to be a true charm quilt no fabric can be repeated in the quilt, except for the border. However, you may choose to make a scrappy quilt and it will still qualify.
- Your quilt should be at least 36” x 36” or larger for a child, or at least 42” x 52” or larger for a lap size for an adult. The maximum size for a lap quilt is 72” x 72”, give or take an inch or two. The child’s quilt can be for a boy or girl, and the lap size quilt for either a man or woman.
- All of these quilts will be donated to Fisher House at the National Naval Medical Center in Bethesda after the show, so your quilt will not be returned to you.
- Your quilt can be hand or machine quilted. Non-quilted items will not be accepted.
- Please baste a sleeve to your quilt for hanging in the show. The sleeve will be removed following the show and returned to you, if requested. The sleeve should be positioned ½” to ¾” below the top edge of the quilt, NOT sewn into the binding. The sleeve allows us to pin through the sleeve instead of the quilt when hanging. The quilt should also have a label on it containing the quiltmaker’s name. As with last year’s challenge, should you choose not to attach a permanent label to the back, an FSQ service projects label will be attached before the quilt is taken to Fisher House.
- Register your intent to participate. Registration forms will be available at guild meetings. These rules can also be found on the FSQ website under 2010 Quilt Show Challenges. . .

Deadline: for turning in your challenge quilts is Saturday, April 17th at Quilt Turn-in.
