Ellen Strait has 7 more quilts to tie & bind. Please volunteer and give her the finished quilts. Also, there is a need for big quilts for the homeless; they will take large quilt tops to finish. Please contact Ellen Strait to finish ABC quilts.

The Lancaster Quilt and Textile Museum sent us a Thank You for our donation. We also got a Thank You from The Montgomery County Hospice for our donation from last year's raffle quilt.

This year's Rose Hill Quilt Show will be held on March 12-14.

### Quilt Show Announcements

Diane Heller hopes that everyone will get involved. The quilt show provides an excellent place to meet and make better friends with quilt guild members.

Barbara Kahla hopes that everyone saw the quilt registration form in last newsletter. The deadline to submit registration forms is the March Meeting. Please have a picture stapled to it. Large quilts must have 4-inch sleeve stitched on. All quilts should have a label on bottom left. The Miniature category is a scaled down version of larger quilt where the individual blocks are less than 4 inches & quilts measure no more than 72 inches in perimeter.

Saturday, April 17<sup>th</sup>, is the day to turn in quilts at the church. Please put a priority number on your registrations in the event that the number of quilts exceeds our capacity to display them. Please indicate the order in which you want them hung. We need help processing registration forms and taking in quilts on the 17<sup>th</sup>. Please contact Barbara if you can assist.

Peggy Kipling needs members to sign up to volunteer at the show. Working 2 hours gets you free admission. Also, we are signing up husbands and sons to help on Wednesday night & Thursday AM for setup. We also need them for security during the show.

JoAnn Aulick needs volunteers to adopt a shop to support publicity. This involves keeping your favorite store or library supplied with fliers. Please take fliers home and give them to everyone you know who may attend. Also, our show's press release is on Page 22 of the Country Register.

Sandra Chin has raffle tickets available in the lobby for the featherweight sewing machine, case and accessories.

Leslie Sorenson & Linda August will be providing food for vendors and instructors throughout the show. Snacks for volunteers will be provided on Wednesday night and Thursday morning. Donate non-perishable food for snacks at the show. Please bring donations to meeting or to show. We also need two large coolers. Be a volunteer in hospitality area during the show.

Burt White encouraged us to put items into the silent auction. Fill in a registration form and take a picture of the item.

Nancy Colladay explained the Challenge was no specific fabric, no specific design, broad on purpose. It is about setting a personal challenge and leaves it up to the individual quilter to interpret the theme. It might be a technique new to you like stack and whack, embellishing, appliqué. Show theme interpretations include stars, fabric with stars, cats, memories of a vacation. The quilt must be completed since the last quilt show but started anytime. To be entered into the Ultimate Quilt Challenge at AQS, Aug 18- 21, the quilt must measure between 30 and 90 inches across/ top/bottom.

Coralyn Colladay announced that Karen Stone will teach two full day classes this year at the quilt show. In addition, Juanita Canfield will teach full and half day classes. Class roster will be completed shortly.

#### Upcoming Programs/Speakers – Coralyn Colladay

Karen Kay Buckley will conduct an appliqué workshop on February 29<sup>th</sup>, and will speak on March 1<sup>st</sup>.

April program will feature preparation for the quilt show meeting and Quilto. Bring a fat quarter for a card. They will be bundled in baskets as prizes for quilto game.

May program will feature Frieda Anderson on jacket construction.

Tonight's speaker is Bonnie McCaffery who held a workshop yesterday on Fantasy Fabric. She uses embellishments and tinsel under toule. Her work has been in many magazines over the years and she has taught world-wide.

## DON'T MISS THE GEE'S BEND QUILT EXHIBIT

Joyce Rhodes was delighted to attend the opening event of the Gee's Bend Quilts at the Corcoran on February 12, where she met two of the ladies from Gee's Bend, and heard the author of "The Quilts of Gee's Bend", William Arnett. Joyce describes the quilts as vessels of cultural survival and continuity, and says the quilts are portraits of the women's identities. She recommends the exhibit!

Nicki Lynch also encourages everyone to see the Gee's Bend Quilt Exhibit. She writes: If you've only read about them in *The Washington Post* or *Quilter's Newsletter Magazine*, "The Quilts of Gee's Bend" are now on display at the Corcoran (500 17<sup>th</sup> St. NW, Washington). A short walk from the Red Line's Farragut North Station or the Orange/Blue Line's Farragut West Station, the Corcoran is a private museum that brings in many traveling art exhibits. "The Quilts of Gee's Bend" display covers the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor and is well worth the walk up. The quilts are done in primitive style - the binding is wavy, the quilting (when used) is uneven and haphazard, the fabrics range from corduroy to shiny polyester, the blocks are only suggestions and the patterns come mainly from the creativity of the quilter. However, "The Quilts of Gee's Bend" are expressively energetic and utilitarian, with no embellishment. They are mostly hand pieced and hand quilted, with a few done by machine. The show includes a short documentary film of several of the quilters talking about their life and quilting. After enjoying the show, drop by the gift shop which has a variety of books, audio and video tapes, postcards, magnets, rugs and mugs that celebrate these quilts as well as the small town of Gee's Bend, Alabama.

"The Quilts of Gee's Bend" will be exhibited through May 17<sup>th</sup>. The Corcoran is open every day but Tuesday; admission is \$5 except Monday, which is a free day.

## REGISTER YOUR QUILTS!

A big thanks to Sally Gilbert and Jane Howard for being the first to send me their quilt registrations. They arrived a few days after the February newsletter. Remember, the deadline for submitting Quilt Registrations is the March 1st guild meeting. Additional forms are available from the FSQ website ([www.friendshipstar.org](http://www.friendshipstar.org)). Please staple your photos to the back of your forms, one form for each quilt. If you will not be attending the guild meeting, mail the forms to the address at the bottom.

Because of the volume of quilts we received last year, we are including a place for you to write a "Priority number" for each quilt. In the event that we have to limit our more prolific members to a smaller number of quilts, we want to know which quilts they most want to have displayed. So, for example, if you submit 5 quilts and the staging committee feels no more than 4 can be hung, rank them in order of preference and your #5 quilt will be withdrawn.

This year, the committee decided to define the Miniature category by more than just size. Miniature quilts are defined as scaled-down versions of a full size quilt with individual blocks no bigger than 4 inches and a perimeter of less than 72 inches. If your little quilt does not meet the above definition, please enter it in the Small category.

Quilts will be collected on April 17 at the church (time TBA). If you won't be able to turn in your quilt that day, please ask a friend to drop it off or call me prior to 4/17 to make other arrangements.

I still need volunteers to help with accepting quilts on April 17<sup>th</sup>. If you can help, please call Barbara Kahla.

### REMINDERS

1. Large quilts must have a 4" sleeve stitched securely (not pinned) at the top. Make sure the sleeve will support the weight and is the full width of the quilt. This will prevent the quilt from drooping and show it to its best advantage.
2. Each quilt must have a label on the back, bottom left corner (as you face the back of the quilt.)
3. If your piece is framed, it may not have glass in the frame.

## Help Show FSQ's Hospitality!

Thanks to all the volunteers who have already offered items for the Hospitality Room at this year's show. If you haven't already signed up, Linda will have a sign-up sheet with a list of needed items at the membership table during the March and April meetings. If you can't get to a meeting, give her a call. She will even arrange to pick up your food item if that is a problem. Or you can bring your non-perishable items to the April meeting or when you drop off your quilt entries on April 17. We'll give you a call close to show time to help remind you.

Another way to help Hospitality at this year's show is to volunteer to help out for a shift in the Hospitality Room. You will be doing such things as putting out food, keeping things relatively neat, and helping white glove people find their gloves and aprons. If this is something you would like to do, sign up on the show volunteer list for Hospitality Room. Every bit of help makes the show a success.

## Quilt Challenge

We hope by now you have decided to take up the quilt challenge.

How to write your Challenge Quilt Description:

When you write your description on the entry form please keep in mind that this is the description that will hang with your quilt. As you write your description think of a non-quilter viewing your quilt, reading your description, and wondering why this entry qualifies as a challenge quilt. Somewhere on display at the show will be a description of the challenge and it will read:

The Challenge to the guild had two parts - to set a personal challenge, and to interpret the Quilt Show Theme "Stars Across the Centuries". There was no specific fabric that had to be used, no size requirements, the challenge was left very broad to allow for maximum interpretation and creativity. Examples of a personal challenge could be using a new technique, trying out a new design, working with a new tool or fabric, etc. The show theme could be interpreted literally, by including stars somewhere on the quilt (it was decided that anything with points would qualify as a star), or more broadly. Members were encouraged to ignite their imaginations.

Your quilt description should include what personal challenge you set for yourself and how you interpreted the star theme. Please note that you are not limited to 30 words, an exception has been made for the challenge quilts.

# Crafters and Quilters Sell Wares in Boutique

What a great way to market those clever things you enjoy making. All items must be made by members of Friendship Star. Among the more popular items are small sewing accessories (needle cases, pin cushions.)
