## FSQ Sales Tax Information

FSQ is subject to sales tax on merchandise purchased for the guild. We are exempt from state and federal income taxes, but not exempt from Maryland sales tax.

**Our guild is also subject to tax on merchandise sold. This applies to all our sales — including Boutique, Silent Auction, Quilt Show pins, and AQS Book sales. We are required to pay the 5% sales tax on all sales, whether we collect it or not. We now have a permanent sales tax account number to use in filing the returns.**

You can calculate the tax yourself, or use a Sales Tax Table if you find it easier. If you are selling FSQ merchandise, please remember to add 5% tax to all sales — and when you turn in the proceeds, please list the tax separately.

## Quilt Turn-in Information

### Note New Drop off Location

Quilt turn-in is on Saturday April 8 from 12:30pm to 3:30pm at the North Creek Community Center in Montgomery Village. The address is 20125 Arrowhead Road at the corner of Arrowhead and Montgomery Village Avenue. From the intersection of Rt. #355 and Montgomery Village Avenue, go north on Montgomery Village Avenue and turn right on Arrowhead. The center is just past the tennis courts.

- ❖ If you cannot drop off your quilts on that day, you must arrange to have someone else drop them off for you. That is the only time we are collecting quilts.
- ❖ When you drop off your quilts, you will be given a receipt (the top part of your registration form) which you **must** present at the end of the show in order to retrieve your quilt.
- ❖ Please note that if you will be having someone other than you pick up your quilt at the end of the show they will need your receipt. Also please let the people taking in your quilt know if someone else will be picking up your quilt so they can make a note on your registration form.

Beginner? Intermediate? Or Advanced Quilter? There is something for everyone at the "Forever Friends" quilt show, April 21-23, at the Montgomery County Fairgrounds.

Beginners will enjoy **Bonnie McCaffery's** *Fantasy Floral Bouquet*, where silk flowers and other embellishments are captured under tulle to complete an unusual wall hanging in a single class. More advanced quilters will have a lot of fun, too.

Beginners will get a really good start with **Juanita Canfield's** *Prairie Stars*, where a pattern that looks very tricky is pieced in a simple and precise way. Intermediate/advanced quilters will quickly finish the several blocks to make a wallhanging, and everyone will learn the wonderful tips and tricks for which Juanita is well known. A kit including the borders and backing for the blue & white quilt shown on the website is available for \$150.00. These border and backing fabrics are no longer available commercially.

Intermediate/Advanced quilters will kick their design and machine quilting skills up a notch with **Lois Smith's classes**. In the NEW! *Focus on Fabric Variation* class your stash will yield a one-of-a-kind quilt as you play with color and contrast. In *Icelandic Machine Quilting Designs* you'll learn to make swirls, drops, and columns inspired by Lois' trip to Iceland—the perfect class for the confident machine quilter, and for those of us who want to build some more confidence. (NOTE: a sewing machine, well-oiled, and with a quilting foot, is a must for this class.)

Bonnie McCaffery's *Painted Face Workshop* is full, but you will be placed on a wait list if you register after March 12.

**The ABC Baby Quilt Project Disbands - Additional Outlets for Quilts Sought** Because we are all busy getting ready for the Quilt Show, there are no workshops planned for April.

On Friday, March 10, we received notice that the ABC Quilt Project has disbanded after 17 years of providing quilts and comfort to children at risk. The ABC board reached that decision after the loss of their corporate sponsorship. They have recommended that in the future we donate our quilts to the Linus Project.

Anne Weaver, the next project coordinator, and I will be looking into the Linus Project, which we have supported in the past, and other possible outlets for the service project quilts.

We still have 50 tops to be tied and bound, so I will be announcing workshops after the Quilt Show.

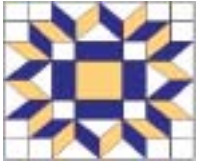
**JoAnna Kruse** noted that **Rina Meushaw** is our new Sunshine Chairperson. Notify Rina whenever you know of anyone who needs a card.
