T shirt quilt supply list. 8/10/09
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Come with a design plan. With or without sashing and the overall size plan.

- Iron on fusible interfacing 10 yards (I like medium) Fusible interfacing needs to be non-woven, glued only on one side and should not be paper-backed. Paper-backed interfacing usually means that both sides are glue-based
- Cutting supplies
 Cutting board, straight edge, sharp rotary cutter,
 large scissor
- large plastic cutting squares work great (12 ½ inch) This will be your clear plastic template and will be used to cut T-shirt panels. Bring the size to fit your design.
- Iron and ironing surface
- Fabric for the sashing and binding on the quilt top (You'll need 100 percent cotton fabric for the sashing and binding.)
- Safety Pins and sewing supplies
- Thread grey or to match sashing
- Quilt back (I use sheets most of the time. They are great for size and no seams.)
- Quilt batting
- 24 to 40 t shirts. (can use sweat shirts and other clothing) Prewash all T-shirts, but don't use softener on them. The T-shirt fabric will not adhere to the fusible interfacing when softener is used.
- sewing machine (quarter inch and quilting foot)
- extension cord
- any other items that you use in quilting, cutting and pressing.
